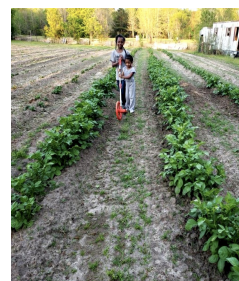

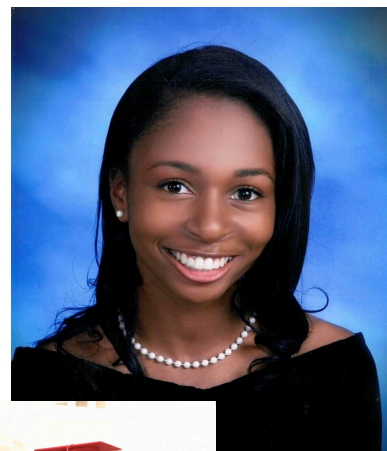

Sandhills Family Heritage Association (SFHA) continues the goal of providing information and services to the community that assists with Land Loss Prevention and sustaining economic assets and resources related to land ownership. SFHA future plans include arranging for experts and professionals to facilitate this outcome. SFHA believes that land provides families and communities with a resource for food, freedom, prosperity, family security, self-sufficiency and abundance. Helping African American landowners to retain ownership of their land and promoting options for land conservation and rural economic development are major components of the SFHA's work. This work has been on-going since the organization's inception. Using the following outline from the Land Loss Prevention Project served as an excellent guide for past SFHA Community Education Workshops. These topics provided an array of challenges faced by landowners and their heirs.

1. DEEDS - Protect Your Right to Your Land with a Deed
2. TAXES - Pay Your Taxes - Prevent Tax Lien Sales and Foreclosures
3. WILLS - Make a Will - Avoid the Pitfalls of Heir Property
4. HEIR PROPERTY—Communicate with Heirs to Avoid Loss of Land
5. PARTITIONS - Protect Your Rights Against a Partition Action
6. ADVERSE POSSESSION – Watch Out for Anyone Trying to Claim Your Land
7. MINERAL RIGHTS - Do Not Give Away Part of Your Land by Accident
8. FARM ISSUES - Take Advantage of Programs Designed to Assist Farmers
9. EMINENT DOMAIN - Know Your Rights Regarding Eminent Domain
